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
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## Citizen Insecurities and Democracy in the Americas: Looking Back over a Decade of the LAPOP AmericasBarometer, 2004-2014



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#### Focal Points of Today's Presentation

- I. Crime is increasingly worrisome for residents of the region. Per the UNODC:
  - Homicide about 7x higher in Americas than Asia/Europe
  - 1/3 of all the homicides in the world occur in the Americas
  - Gang and organized crime-linked homicide = 30% of all murders in the Americas, 1% in Asia and Europe
  - Homicide conviction rate in the Americas is ½ the rate than that in Europe
- II. Citizens are increasingly affected by crime in their daily lives
- III. These concerns are grounded in personal experience
- IV. Crime is eroding support for key democratic institutions


## The **AmericasBarometer**

Latin American Public Opinion Project

A Project Proyecto de Opinión Pública de América Latina



2004-2014: ~232,000 interviews



- The only household survey that includes North, Central and South America, and key countries in the Caribbean
- Minimum of 1,500 interviews per country
- Nationally representative; includes rural and urban areas
- Face-to-face interviews, conducted in more than 10 languages
- Multiple pre-tests conducted over the course of a year





#### LAPOP Survey Sample Optimizer (LASSO) Computer Vision for Counting Rooftops



- Java-based code permits use on multiple desktop and mobile platforms (PC, Mac, Android)
- Point-and-click GUI allows areas to easily be selected or deselected from the satellite image

- Native C-compiled OpenCV code runs object analysis
- Pre-compiled executable can be multithreaded

The only regional survey using handheld computers, with software developed by academic partners in Costa Rica and **Bolivia:** 


- Reduces data entry errors













Citizens of the Americas are more concerned about crime today than in the past





#### The majority of respondents report that their neighborhoods are affected by gangs:










### Concerns about safety on public transportation are nearly universal

**FEAR6e.** And in general, how worried are you that someone in your family will be assaulted on public transportation? Would you say a lot, somewhat, a little, or not at all?




### Concerns about safety at schools are even more widespread

FEAR6f. And how worried are you about the safety of children in school? Would you say a lot, somewhat, a little, or not at all?




#### Fears of assault and robbery increased between 2012 and 2014



## Perceptions of insecurity are grounded in the reality of crime victimization

#### Crime victimization is associated with greater feelings of insecurity






Yet, reports of crime victimization vary greatly across countries

## This is in part because we find striking differences in types of crime rates within neighborhoods throughout the Americas












## Regionally, 40% of respondents of the Americas avoid walking through dangerous areas

#### Crime and insecurity lead individuals to avoid walking through dangerous areas




Predictor of avoiding dangerous areas because of fear of crime



#### Across time, on average, support vigilante justice hovers around 30 units on a 0-100 scale






#### Insecurity is a positive predictor of support for vigilante justice

Those who were a victim of a crime were much more likely to report intentions to emigrate







## On average, there is almost an even split across the Americas between those with some level of satisfaction and some level of dissatisfaction with local police performance




Satisfaction with police performance varies strongly across countries



## Greater insecurity is linked to greater dissatisfaction with the police




#### What else fuels discontent with the police?

On average across the Americas, the majority of respondents indicate that typical police response time is more than 30 minutes




**INFRAX.** Suppose someone enters your home to burglarize it and you call the police. How long do you think it would take the police to arrive at your house on a typical day around noon?

# Trust in the National Police, the courts, and the justice system: Declined across the Americas between 2012-2014 (on average, regionally)







# Fear of crime and crime victimization are affecting citizen policy preferences









#### System support fell to its lowest level in 2014, since 2006







# System support in 2014 is highest in Costa Rica and lowest in Brazil






#### Levels of political tolerance declined in 2014



# Percentage of those with attitudes consistent with "stable democracy" fell to their lowest, and "democracy at risk" rose to its highest level, region-wide for the decade in 2014

At best, most countries have only modest percentages of populations having attitudes supporting stable democracy.

### Summing up

Looking back over a decade of LAPOP's AmericasBarometer:

- Concerns over crime and violence are elevated
- These concerns are rooted in crime victimization
- These factors affect individuals' behaviors, intentions to emigrate, preferences for hardline policies, evaluations of the police and the incumbent administration, system support, and tolerance
- Democratic legitimacy has decreased, in part due to crime, violence, and the insecurity it fuels
