

Curated by Gabriela Rangel

In his new series *Prussian Blue*, Yishai Jusidman, born in Mexico City in 1963, finds an alternative way to address the meeting of collective memory and aesthetics in order to deal with the major concerns of contemporary memorials and history-based artistic deliverances. Jusidman's new paintings provide an insightful approach to the dark strictures that have dominated the production of works dealing with the representation of the Holocaust. The exhibition includes a condensed library in which selected books and films about the relationship between memory, trauma, and artistic representation will be available for public use.




