



On view: Tuesday, September 10-Saturday, December 14, 2013

Curated by Gabriela Rangel and Christina De León

Cristóbal Lehyt's (b. Santiago de Chile, 1973) site-specific installation *Iris Sheets*, fragmented in three interrelated pieces, proposes an experiential encounter with the audience. The centerpiece is a gigantic snake-like form that weaves through the gallery, mimicking its architecture. Made with natural wood drenched in Chilean wine, the piece engages the viewers' perception of space, while also teasing the senses. Working in tandem with the monumental three-dimensional sculpture, Lehyt's wall painting is based on his "Drama Projection" series, drawings in which the artist projects his own fantasies upon his everyday encounters with unknown men and women. Lehyt also connects the interior with the exterior by hanging a banner on Americas Society's historic building featuring an image of the Chilean singer Violeta Parra, along with the phrase "Thanks to life for giving me so much," lyrics from her iconic song.




