Told and Untold: The Photo Stories of Kati Horna in the Illustrated Press



Curated by Michel Otayek and Christina De León

Told and Untold features Kati Horna (Budapest, 1912-Mexico City, 2000), one of the very few women who photographed the frontlines of the Spanish Civil War. Following Franco's victory, Horna fled to Mexico and began a lifelong engagement with the Mexican illustrated press. Her work focused on modern Mexican architecture and portraits of prominent cultural figures. The exhibition includes Horna's never-before-seen personal photo album from the Spanish Civil War and a selection of her photographs alongside the periodicals that put them in circulation.


